Best Practice-1

1. Title of the Practice

Digitization of College Documents and Processes for Efficiency and Accessibility

2. Objectives of the Practice

- To digitize the administrative and library-related processes in order to make it learner-centric.
- To streamline the library and administrative processes for staff and students, based on documents.
- To facilitate faster data retrieval.

3. The Context

The voluminous data of staff and students becomes challenging to manage manually. Digitization aids in reducing paper work, meticulous storage and retrieval of data.

4. The Practice

• QR Codes: A QR code list is displayed. Students click on the required codes and get clarity about the process. For instance, a student clicks on the QR code for Railway concession and is directly taken to the process. This saves time from the point of view of students and eases the burden on the administrative staff. This is illustrated below in the form of an infograph:














To address this issue, a layout of the entire library shelves has been made. Before issuing any book, a student can search the book in Somaiya OPAC to see which shelf it lies on. It can also show where the shelves are kept in the library. The library is thus fully computerized without any expenditure.















The previous five to six years question papers are now provided to the students through this QR code so that effortless access is available to them from anywhere and at any time. This makes it easy for them to analyze the question papers.






For instance, on clicking on the file number 1 named 'Audit', one is directly taken to the following drive link from where any file related to audit can be accessed.

2. Objective of the Practice

3. The Context

The school dropout rate in Class 10 stands (nearly 3.5 million) at 20.6 % in India, as per an article published in The Times of India in 2021-22.

The states affected with highest rates of dropout are Odisha (49.9%), Bihar (42.1%), Meghalaya, Karnataka and Assam. In Maharashtra, the dropout rate at secondary level was 10.7% in 2021-22. The major causes of dropout include lack of interest in studies, difficulty in following the instructions in schools, lack of support from parents, inadequacy in quality teaching etc.

K. J. Somaiya College of Science and Commerce is committed to combating the problem of school dropouts through its social outreach program, Tarangan. It is a college-based social outreach program dedicated to supporting underprivileged students from Mumbai slums of nearby areas who struggle to continue their education.
