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
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



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# Unsung women heroes

(Spy Princess - Noor Inayat Khan)

"Women is capable of every great heroism; it was women who found a means of conquering the formidable obstacles of her environment, establishing herself creator of the earth, and laying the foundations of civilization"

Noor Inayat Khan was an Indian spy and the only female radio operator to be sent to Nazi-occupied France in WWII. It is remarkable how Noor, who was raised on the principles of religious tolerance, and non-violence decided to take up the most dangerous mission that lead to her daring career. A tigress on the field, this lady remains an inspiration for generations.

"The role of women has always been undervalued in the spy world, always undermined in terms of recognition. Unfairly so. It's a world that needs women"

The war heroine was born on 2nd January 1914 in Moscow to an Indian father, Hazrat Inayat Khan and an American mother. She is the great-great-great granddaughter of Tipu Sultan, the eighteenth- century Muslim ruler. Her father was a Sufi Muslim who founded the *Mystical Sufi Order* of the West.

Inayat's father decided to spread his peaceful and non-dogmatic faith through music. She grew up in the suburbs of Paris in a loving house called *'Fazal Manzil'*. Even today, a military band plays outside her house on Bastille Day to honour her for the French Resistance.

She studied music at the *Paris Conservatory* and Child Psychology at *Sorbonne*. At 25, she wrote the book *'Twenty Jataka Tales'* which is drawn from the famous legends of the former life of the Buddha in 1939. Most remember her as a kind, dreamy and sensitive girl.

She was the eldest of the four children. She was forced to grow up and become a leader when she suddenly lost her father

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during his visit to India in 1927. As for her personal life, it is said that she was engaged to a pianist of Jewish origin and later had an engagement with a fellow British officer.

"Courage is the one choice if you want to live your best life. Rise above everything that may bring you down or make you feel inferior"

After Germany invaded France in 1940, Khan and her brother Vilayet decided to face Nazi aggression. Vilayet told Shrabani Basu (author of the biography Spy Princess: The life of Noor Inayat Khan) that the brothersister duo pledged "to thwart the aggression of the tyrant". They took a flight from Paris to Bordeaux and then undertook a seaborne journey in a boat to England.

There, Inayat joined the Women's Auxiliary Air Force (WAAA) and was later recruited by Winston Churchill's secret force, Special Operation Executive (SOE). She was the first female radio operator who was sent to Nazi-occupied France in World War II with the codename 'Madeline'. Most lasted only six weeks for this job. The report accounted her as 'unsuitable to work in her field'.

There was a mass arrest by the Gestapo (German states secret police during the Nazi regime) who completely destroyed the SOE's spy network back in Paris. She was ordered to go back home but she decided not to leave the job. This was because she did not want to leave her fellow commanders without any communication.

"It takes a great deal of bravery to stand up to our enemies, but just as much to stand up to our friends."

The job was described by General Sir Colin Gubbins as the principal and most dangerous post in France. She lasted for 3 and a half months for this job by changing appearances and allies. Being the only undercover agent left, she was single-handedly sending messages back to London.

"Success is not final, failure is not fatal: it is the courage to continue that counts."

But as fate would have it, she was

betrayed by Renne Garry, the sister of one of the colleagues. It took six men to hold her down while she was being arrested. Later, she was imprisoned in Pforzheim prison in Germany. For almost ten months, she did not reveal any details despite being starved, beaten and tortured by the Nazis.

"It takes courage to grow up and become who you really are."

Later, due to her courage and two escape attempts, she was labelled as 'dangerous'. As a result of which, she was sent to the Dachau concentration camp. There she was shot dead on 13 September 1944, at the age of 30. The spy heroine's last words were 'liberte' which she screamed at the Nazi shooting squad.

"Legacy is not leaving something for people. It's leaving something in people."

She was posthumously awarded the George Cross (the highest gallantry award alongside Victoria Cross). Later, she was honoured with a Croix de Guerre with a silver star in France along with two memorials and a ceremony. In 2006, Shrabani Basu wrote an autobiography called Spy Princess: The Life of Noor Inayat Khan and is also the founder of the Noor Inayat Khan Memorial Trust.

Noor was an incredibly brave woman who died fighting for her country. This memorial was made so that she does not fade away from our memory. Stacy Erickson wrote a poem called 'resistance' and dedicated it to Noor on 6th September 2010. Noor's life was full of courage and an admirable vision – which makes it inspirational for generations.

Maurice Buckmaster, a former colonel of Noor, said that "no one had mentioned Noor's extraordinary beauty". From her fellow commanders at SOE to the governor of Pforzheim Jail she left everyone moved. She decided her own journey, without any obligation from family, friends, traditions, or country.

It was her decision to risk becoming a spy when most said she was unfit; stayed back in Paris when her fellow commanders asked her to leave for home and fought with the Nazi's with invincible courage. This was not it. When arrested, she tried to make two escape attempts to fight even further. Noor Inayat Khan remains the epitome of invincible courage and determination.

"I glorified you on earth, having accomplished the work that you gave me to do."

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# Diversity of fauna in the Somaiya, Vidyavihar campus

I, Prathamesh Amberkar, am a student of TYBSc. Zoology. I am a passionate naturalist and conservationalist and have made an attempt to document the Faunal diversity of Somaiya Vidyavihar campus.

Since the past year I have been keeping a record of fauna within the campus which includes birds, reptiles, amphibians, butterflies, spiders and various other insects. All the birds, reptiles, amphibians, insects etc. make a very important part of the ecosystem. Even if one of them is disturbed or vanished it disturbs the whole ecosystem including us, humans. So in order to maintain a healthy ecosystem it is important to know about the species, both flora and fauna around us and how they are correlated or how they are interdependent on each other. Inspite of Mumbai being a city with a large population of humans and a great amount of pollution and disturbance, it has a good diversity of flora and fauna.

Birds are great pollinators and they also help in dispersing seeds. As birds also feed on insects they keep a good control on the insect population. I recorded a total of 32 bird species, which includes a few raptors (birds of prey), few flycatchers, nectar feeders, waders (water birds), sparrows, parakeets, munias, orioles, hoopoe, swifts, drongos two species of Kingfishers etc. Despite the fact that our campus is placed in the middle of the city, such number of species in such a small area is sign of a healthy ecosystem. There were also few bird nesting site spotted in the campus.

Reptiles are one the best pest controllers, they feed on rats, mice and various other insects controlling the spread of various disease. The reptile count went up to a total of ten species which included five snake species (out of the five snakes four were totally harmless or non-venomous while the one specie the Russell's viper is highly venomous), four lizard species and a terrapin (freshwater turtle) specie. The presence of terrapin and snakes turned out to be a total surprise.

Amphibians are pollution indicators they only found in clean and pollution free environment. Two species of frogs were recorded, the Indian bull frog and frogs from the genus Fejervarya.

A total of 32 species of butterflies are recorded which also included some uncommon butterflies like the Black rajah butterfly. The other butterflies species include Common Mormon, Painted lady, Commander butterfly, Tiger butterfly, the Wanderer, few butterflies from the family of Blues etc. Apart from the butterflies other insects like the praying mantis, dragonflies, various bugs and beetles, Ants and bees are also present.

Spiders belong to the class Arachnida, they are known for their ability to produce silk like material which they also use for spinning their webs. Not all spiders build webs like the Jumping and the wolf spiders. The Spider species included various species of Jumping spiders, Orbs weavers, Lynx Spiders, Wolf spiders, two tailed spider, the ant mimic spider from the family of Jumping spiders, cellar spiders.

त्या दिवसानंतर तेजश्री आणि माझी भेट अशी काही झाली नाही. कधी रस्त्यात दिसलो तर हाय आणि बायचं बोलणं असायचं. कधी नजर भिडलीच तर ती बघून हसायची. मी ही ओठांवर हास्य ओढून तिला प्रतिउत्तर द्यायचो. पण का कोणास ठाऊक पण मला तिचं हसू खोट वाटायच. तिच्या त्या हस्त्या ओठांच्या चेहऱ्यामागे एक हिरमुसला चेहरा मला कायम दिसायचा. एक महिना असाच गेला. आता डिसेंबर झालेला फेस्ट संपले होते आणि वेळ होता जानेवारी मधल्या चाचणी परीक्षांचा. पूर्ण महिना मजा मारून आता मी अभ्यासाला बसलो होतो. दोन-चार अजून दिवस गेले आणि अभ्यासात लक्ष्य लागू लागलं. असच एका सकाळी रिकाम्या वाचनालयात बसलो होतो निवांत अभ्यास करत बसलो होतो. वाचनालयातली माझी जागा ठरली होती तिथेच मी कायम अभ्यासाला बसायचो. कॉलेजच्या वाचनालय असं होत की डावी बाजू मुलांची आणि उजवी मुलींची होती आणि मध्ये पुस्तकांची कपाटं होती. त्या दिवशी सकाळी सुद्धा असाच बसलो असताना मला मुलींच्या सेक्शनमध्ये (भागात) कोणीतरी आल्याचे जाणवले. २ मिनिटे वाचनालयात शांतता टिकून होती पण नंतर कोणीतरी हंदके भरत रडायचा आवाज मला येऊ लागला. मी लक्ष्य नाही दिलं. पण काही वेळानंतर तिथे कोणी,

हे गाणं गाऊ लागलं. एका क्षणात मी तो आवाज तेजश्रीचा आहे हे ओळखलं. कोणीतरी गातयं हे ऐकून ग्रंथपाल शांत करायला म्हणून त्याच्या डेस्कबाहेर पडणार तो मीच तिला थांबवायला उठलो. मला पाहून ग्रंथपाल बसला आणि कोण गातय तिला शांत बसायला सांग म्हणून सांगितले. मी गर्ल्स सेक्शनमध्ये गेलो तोच मला तेजश्री दिसली. पण या वेळी तिच्या त्या आवाजात हुंदके जाणवत होते बोचऱ्या दुःखाचे !

फार बेढब (र्ज़्रुरीव) परिस्थितीत मी तिला हाय म्हंटल. तिने गाणं थांबवलं नाही डोळे उघडून मला बिघतलं डोळ्यातली आसवं हलकेच टिपत तिनेही हाय म्हंटल आणि बघून हसली नेहमीसारखी. मी सहज म्हणून विचारलं की तू ठीक आहेस ना ? आणि तिने एका शब्दात उत्तर दिलं नाही आणि तिला मोकळेपणाने बोलायचं आहे असं म्हणून ती मला कॅन्टीनला घेऊन गेली. मला तीच अस वागणं थोडं वेगळं वाटलं पण एक कप चहा आणि ती समोर असताना मला आणखी काय हवं होत. तिने चहाचा एक घोट घेतला आकाशाकडे बिघतलं आता ती बोलणार तोच, रेडिओची कॅसेट अडकावी तशी ती अडकली आणि शांत झाली. तिचा हिरमुसला चेहरा मी पुन्हा पकडला. कॉमर्स मधला असून एकवेळ मी हिशोबात चुकलो असतो पण कलाकार हाडाचा होतो खरे-खोटे भाव ओळखायला आजपर्यंत कधी चुकलो नव्हतो. माझ्या या विचारात तिने तिचा प्रश्र्न बदलला आणि विचारलं तू कोणती कला येते मी सुद्धा म्हणालो शब्दांची जुळवाजुळवं करून बनवतो काही कविता त्यावर ती म्हणाली, शब्द कसे असतात हे शब्द आकाशा एवढे विचार थोडक्यात समजावणारे, वळव् तसे वळणारे, सोपे, मधुर पण अपुरे . . . . . !

कॉलेजच्या चाचणी परीक्षा होऊन आता महिना उलटला होता, सगळ्याच मुलांच्या मनात आता वार्षिक परीक्षेची धास्ती होती. सगळे बॅलन्स शीट बॅलन्स करत असताना माझी मात्र वेगळीच केमिस्ट्री सुरू झाली होती. त्या दिवसानंतर तेजश्री आणि मी रोज भेटायचो निदान ४-५ तास तरी गप्पा व्हायच्या आमच्या, काही वेळ ती तिच्या आवाजाची जादू दाखवायची तर मी कधी माझ्या शब्दांची. तिच्याशी बोलताना तोंडातून निघालेला प्रत्येक शब्द जड वाटायचा, तिचे विचारच तसे होते. गप्पांचा विषय कितीही हलका किंवा जड असो तिच्या चेहऱ्यावर

# शर्वरी प्रशांत बोटे FYBsc.

भाषा म्हणजे काय? भाषेची गरज काय? तर अंतकरणातले भाव व्यक्त करते ती भाषा. संदेशवहनापासून संस्कृतीवहनापर्यंतचे काम करते ती भाषा. संस्कृती म्हणजे शरीर व भाषा म्हणजे आत्मा. ज्याप्रमाणे आत्मा नसल्यास शरीर निष्क्रिय होते त्याचप्रमाणे भाषेशिवाय संस्कृतीवहनाचे कार्य कठीण होऊन बसते. अशीच एक संस्कृतीवहनाचे कार्य करणारी आपली मायबोली मराठी भाषा.

असे म्हणतात, संस्कृत ही सर्व भाषांची जननी आहे म्हणूनच मराठी भाषेचा उगम संस्कृतपासून झाला. मराठी भाषा ही प्राकृत भाषा आहे. मऱ्हाठ्ठी, मराठ्ठी, महाराष्ट्रीय प्राकृत, अपभ्रंश मराठी ते आजची आधुनिक मराठी असा मराठी भाषेचा प्रवास जिला खऱ्या अर्थाने छत्रपती शिवाजी महाराजांच्या काळात राजाश्रय मिळाला.

भाषा साहित्य लोकांपर्यंत पोहचवते परंतु साहित्य म्हणजे काय? तर 'हितेन साहितम्' म्हणजेच जे हिताचे सांगते. ते साहित्य पूर्वीच्या काळात जेव्हा मोठ्या प्रमाणात साहित्य संस्कृत भाषेत लिहिले जायचे त्या काहात, मुकुंदराजाने मराठी भाषेतला आद्यग्रंथ लिहिणारे पहिले कवी म्हणून मुकुंदराजाला आद्याकवी असे संबोधले जाते. त्याचबरोबर संतांनी मराठी भाषेचे साहित्य शोभिवंत केले. 'लोपले ज्ञान जगी। हित नेणीवे कोणी। अवतार पांडुरंगा।' म्हणजेच काय तर जेव्हा जगातले ज्ञान लोप पावत चालले होते. अज्ञानाचा अंधःकार झाला होता, हिताचे काय ते कोणीच सांगत नव्हते. अशा वेळी साक्षात पांडुरंगाचा अर्थात भगवंताचा अवतार घेऊन संत जन्माला आले. संत ज्ञानेश्वर जेव्हा 'अमृतानुभव' हा ग्रंथ लिहित होते. तेव्हा त्यात पहिले पाच श्लोक हे संस्कृत भाषेत होते. परंतु त्यांना निवृत्ती महाराजांनी सांगितले, ''हे ज्ञान लोकांपर्यंत पोहचले पाहिजे व त्यासाठी ते बोलीभाषेत लिहिले पाहिजे.'' म्हणून त्या ग्रंथातील पाचव्या श्लोकानंतर पुढील सर्व श्लोक प्राकृत भाषेत लिहिले गेले.

जुन्या काळातील कालिदासांनी लिहिलेले 'शाकुंतल' बिघतल्यास लक्षात येते की फक्त उच्चवर्णीय लोकांना संस्कृत भाषेत संवाद लिहिलेले होते तर इतरांना मात्र प्राकृत भाषेत संवाद देण्यात आलेले, अशी भेद करणारी संस्कृत वाणी. तिच्या बद्दल बोलताना संत एकनाथांनी

चपराक लगावली, 'संस्कृतवाणी देवे केली तर प्राकृत काय चोरापासूनी झाली?''

समाजाचा सांस्कृतिक इतिहास हा लोकसाहित्यातून जपला जातो. मराठी भाषेचे सर्वसमावेशक व समग्र रूप लोकसाहित्यात आढळते. म्हणी, वाक्प्रचार, नृत्यगीते, रमगीते, उपासना गीते, बारसेगीते, खेळगीते, फुगडी-फेरा-पिंगा-कांडणी-कापणी आणि जात्यावरच्या ओव्या असा मराठी भाषेला लाभलेला वारसा.

जुन्या काळातील लोक म्हणायचे की महाराष्ट्रामध्ये दर दहा कोसावर पाणी व वाणी बदलाताना दिसून येते. महाराष्ट्राच्या प्रत्येक भागात मराठीचे वेगळे रूप पाहायला व ऐकायला मिळते. विविध भागातल्या उपबोली, पोटभाषा या साऱ्यांचे मिळून मराठी भाषेचे अवकाश तयार होते. भाषिक सहभागाने भाषा समृद्ध व्हावी. तिची जडणघडण व्हावी. तसे असेल तरच ती भाषा सांस्कृतिक वैविध्य असलेल्या प्रदेशात एकसंघता राखू शकते.

मराठी भाषा म्हणजे केवळ प्रमाण भाषा नव्हे. बोलीभाषेवर प्रमाणभाषा लादणे म्हणजे भाषेच्या शेवटाकडे वाटचाल करण्यासारखे असते. इतरांच्या राजभाषा सिंहासनापुढे खालमानेने उभ्या असलेल्या दिसून येतात. परंतु आपली मराठी भाषा जिची जडणघडण सांस्कृतिक वर्चस्ववादाने झाली. तिच्यापुढे इतर भाषा व संस्कृती गौण ठरतात.

या साऱ्याची सुरुवात केली तो महानुभव पंथाच्या महदंबेच्या धवळ्यांनी. महानुभाव पंथाने संस्कृतीची जोखड झुगारून देऊन बहुजनवादी मराठीचा पाया रोवला. संत जनाबाईंची 'डोईचा पदर खांद्यावर घेऊन भरल्या बाजारात जाण्याची' भाषा स्त्रीमुक्तीचा उद्घोष करते. तर दुसऱ्या बाजुला त्यांच्या जात्यावरच्या ओव्या ग्रामीण लोकतत्त्वाशी नाते सांगून जातात.

आपल्या मराठी भाषेला आता 'अभिजात मराठी'चा दर्जा मिळवून देण्याच्या हालचाली चालू झाल्या व स्थापना झाली. 'प्रा. रंगनाथ पठारे समिती'ची 'अभिजात' हा केंद्र सरकारकडून दिला जाणार विशिष्ट दर्जा आहे. जो मिळाल्यास भाषेच्या संवर्धनासाठी भरीव अनुदान दिले जाते.

अभिजात भाषेचा दर्जा मिळावा यासाठी निकष असतात ते म्हणजे, पहिला - भाषा प्राचीन व साहित्य श्रेष्ठ असावी, दुसरा - भाषेचे वय दिड ते अडीच हजार वर्षे इतके असावे, तिसरा - भाषेचे स्वयंभूपण असावे, चौथा - भाषेचे प्राचीन व आधुनिक रुप यांच्यात गाभा कायम असावा.

अभिजात भाषेचा दर्जा मिळाल्यास मराठी भाषेचा साहित्यसंग्रह करणे, महाराष्ट्रातील १२००० ग्रंथालये मराठीत करणे, भारतातील ४५० विद्यापीठांमध्ये मराठी शिकवण्याची सोय होईल असे फायदे होतील. असे फायदे होत असल्यास मराठी नक्कीच 'अभिजात मराठी' झाली माहिजे. केंद्र सरकारणे ठेवलेले चारही निकष सिद्ध करून आपली भाषा 'अभिजात' नक्कीच ठरेल व पुढील वर्षी निबंधस्पर्धेचा विषय फक्त मराठी नव्हे तर 'अभिजात मराठी' असेल हा विश्वास.

It was celebrated on 8th and 9th January 2020. Several intercollegiate competitions viz., Zayqa, Jugad, Rang de, Clik it and Treasure hunt was organized during event. The fest was inaugurated by Dr. Suman Govil (Retd. Advisor-STAR DBT Scheme, UGC, Dept. of Biotechnology). She presented various career branches in biological sciences to the students. light upon the different applications of the field of statistics in the real world and different opportunities in abroad after completing UG/PG statistics. Also students gave presentations on the topics:

i) Application of DLS method in cricket

- i) Application of DLS method in cricket ii) Analysis of the sales of paracetamol
- iii) Forensic statistics.
- 2. Lecture on "Pre-clinical trials": On Thursday 29<sup>th</sup> August 2019, guest lecture for students of T.Y.B.Sc. and M.Sc. (Statistics) was arranged under the STAR-DBT scheme. The guest speaker was Dr. Yogesh Tamhankar who has done his Masters in Ayurvedic Medicine and currently pursuing

his Ph.D which is based on pre-clinical trials for prevention of Breast Cancer. Around 50 students from T.Y.B.Sc.(Statistics) and 16 students from M.Sc.(Applied Statistics) attended the lecture. The emphasis of the lecture was on the different phases of clinical trials with special reference to preclinical trials conducted on Mice. The speaker explained about the different study designs involved in his thesis, the treatments given and the type of data that is generated. The analysis of data was explained by our faculty member Ms. Namrata Nagwekar. She gave some glimpses of the different tests to be used to analyse the data.

- 3. Hands-on-training workshop on Python: This workshop was organised under the STAR-DBT scheme, on every Saturday for 03 hours from 01.30 p.m. 04.30 p.m. for approximately 30 hours. It was one-credit course. 25 T.Y.B.Sc., 02 M.Sc. and 02 alumni statistics students registered for this workshop. 50 marks on-line theory test using MOODLE and 50 marks practical exam were conducted. Objective of the course was to learn basics of Python such as writing loops, decision statements, functions and data manipulation using Python.

The safaris were by gypsy or canter and were amazing learning experiences for the students. They had sightings of leopard, striped hyena, spotted deer, Nilgai, jackal, python, spotted owlet, macqaque, peacocks etc in their natural habitats.

Invited Guest lecture: Careers after Zoology - ECOTOURISM

The Department of Zoology organised a Career Guidance lecture for its second year and Third year students on 25th July 2019 in the Seminar Hall at 10.30 am. This is part of a lecture series we initiated last year to explore various careers available after Zoology. The talk was attended by 91 students and 9 staff members.

The speaker shared his own experiences of being a Zoology Graduate and how he followed his passion of trekking and travelling and translated his dreams into reality.

4. Day Visit for FY to Museum and BNHS

Department of Zoology organised an activity - Excursion to Natural History Section of Chhatrapati Shivaji Maharaj Vastu Sangrahalay and Bombay Natural History Society, Fort, Mumbai on 7th February 2020 for 46 FYBSc students. Students were accompanied by staff members, Ms. Shreya Patil, Ms Chetana Kamekar, Ms. Sadaf Zakariya. Students got an exposure for biodiversity study, They understood concepts of fossilisation and it's significance as evolutionary evidence. They also became familiar to process of taxidermy and model making and they got to know about career opportunities in biodiversity museology.

# 5. 2-day Workshop on Beekeeping at Nashik

A Two Day Workshop on Scientific Beekeeping was organised by Zoology department under CPE grant at Organic Bee Farm by Dr T. B. Nikam at Nasik during 29th July 2019 - 30<sup>th</sup> July 2019 for T.Y.B.Sc students. Dr. Amol Patwardhan, Ms Chetana Kanekar and Ms Shreya Patil accompanied students. Dr T.B Nikam discussed importance of honey bee in agriculture and showed various bee products. 
### Junior College

#### **Attendance Committee**

Attendance committee meetings are held periodically to monitor the students attendance . SMS alerts are sent to notify the parents of students who have less than 75% attendance. A Parent Teacher meeting was held on 10/08/2019 for the students who failed to comply with the minimum attendance prescribed by the university. Around 125 parents attended the meeting with their wards. The Controller of Examination Mrs Madhavi Jardosh and the other members of the examination cell addressed the parents and explained the rules & regulations of the examination system, internal and external components, evaluation pattern and the consequence of non compliance of minimum 75% attendance on the examination.

A student is eligible to appear for the semester examination both theory and practical if he/she has complied with the minimum of 75% attendance. In deserving cases on medical grounds the prescribed attendance requirement is condoned on the production of valid medical certificate. If a student represents his/her institution, university, state or nation in sports, NCC, NSS or cultural or any other activities that are officially sponsored then such students exemption granted on recommendations of the concerned Head of the Department and the Head of the Institution.

First, on 30<sup>th</sup> August 2019 in which free Thalassemia Check-up was also done. The later one was held on 16<sup>th</sup> January 2020. Total 180 Units of blood was collected in the 2 events and 200 people took Thalassemia Check-up.

Blood Stem Cell and Bone Marrow Registration Drive

It was conducted on 31st January 2020 in association with 'DATRI' NGO. It helped in raising awareness on the importance of bone marrow donation for treating various diseases and 160 people willingly got their swabs tested to become potential donors.

#### Swacch Bharat Abhiyan

7 Cleanliness Drives were conducted by

NSS Volunteers at different locations under this Abhiyan. Other activities include a 'Swacchata Rally' and Street Play performance on 'Clean India, Green India' to help raise awareness about importance of Cleanliness.

#### Beej Ball Initiative

This activity took place on 19<sup>th</sup> October 2019. It provided a new experience to volunteers. They learned seed ball making and its effectiveness in planting. It taught them importance of small actions towards the environment.

#### Save Mangrove Mission

NSS Unit organized a visit to Coastal and Marine Biodiversity Centre (Airoli) on 28<sup>th</sup> November 2019, for 40 volunteers, where they explored varieties of animals & plants important for biodiversity and environment.

#### Anti-Plastic Movement

The main purpose of this activity was to reduce the use of plastics to save the mother earth. The volunteers donated the paper bags to the vendors of Dhundalwadi and Police Colony in exchange of a promise that the vendors will try to minimize plastic usage.

#### Library Setup

A group of volunteers started a Book Donation Drive in college with the aim of setting up a library in Dhundalwadi village, Dahanu and on 15<sup>th</sup> Sep. 2019 they successfully set up it Dhundalwadi school.

#### Flood Relief Drive

After heavy rains when flood overtook many areas and cities in maharashtra, NSS unit started Flood Relief donation Drive in our college and collected clothes, food, etc. worth Rs. 10000. Later, it was all sent to Mumbai University on 12<sup>th</sup> Sept. 2019 in order to distribute it to flood affected areas.

#### CDF KJSSC Chapter

Connecting dreams foundation, an organisation which works for welfare of society in entrepreneurial way, joined hands

with our NSS Unit this year. Our team conducted 6 surveys in the adopted area from Nov. 2019 to Dec. 2019 under the 'Connect n Change' project of cdf. And after analysing the data, it decided to start a project 'AAKAR' with the aim of shaping young minds of the mentioned area through creative learning. Our team conducted a 'Yoga Session' on 20 Feb. 2020 in Ramabai Municipal School as its first step towards the project 'AAKAR'. And now, it is planning to move forward, gradually and enthusiastically.

#### NSS Fest SANVAAD

An Intercollegiate fest named 'SANVAAD' on the theme PEACE AND HARMONY was organised on 8th February 2020. The Chief Guests, IPS Quaiser Khalid (Special Inspector General of Police, Maharashtra) inaugurated the event and Ms.Bharagsetu Sharma (Roadies Real Heroes) was the chief guest for the valedictory function, they both motivated the young generation to come forward for social causes. Every coordinator was given the freedom of allocating students to the teachers in the departments. Each teacher in all departments were assigned with the task of mentoring 25-30 students. It was expected that the teacher should:

- (iii) The mentor should establish consistent communication with the students and counsel him wherever necessary and closely monitor the growth of the students.

During induction program for FYBSc students all the coordinators explained the students about the importance of the committee in the slots allotted to them.

It was expected that the two interactions per semester should be done by every teacher. But due to the busy schedule of the teachers, many departments could complete two interactions. But few departments like statistics, IT/CS, Accountancy have not shared their interactions with their department coordinators. The issues raised by the students during first term were reported to the authorities. Some students were also referred to Dr. Srirang Joshi. Some students who had some academic difficulties were guided to respective teachers. But in spite of all this we find that this is not functioning as expected.


In the last meeting we had decided that we would conduct a seminar/workshop for teachers regarding mentoring. It was also decided that we would have a faculty advisor (FA). The FA would then select a team of responsible, sensitive and dedicated student mentors. The FA will be in touch with these student mentors. Each student mentor can be assigned 8-10 students. Student mentors are required to keep track of their mentees with reference to academics, attendance, discipline and overall development and record it in the mentor's diary. Any complaint or compliments regarding mentees should be brought to the notice of the respective FA.

- 6. An MOU was signed by WDC of Somaiya college and Bharatiya Stree Shakti.










