REPORT OF INTRODUCTION TO HEARTFULNESS PRACTICES

Topic of the event: Introduction of Heartfulness Practices

Organizers: Mulya Pravah & IQAC of K. J. Somaiya College of Science and Commerce along with

Heartfulness Institute

Type/venue of event: Three Day Online National Webinar

Date/time of the event: 20th July, 2020 to 22th July, 2020 11.00 am to 12.30 pm

Resource persons were from Heartfulness Institute. They were Mr. Rajagopal Subramanyam, Mrs. Namrata Walvekar and Mrs. Lalita Rajagopal.

The webinar was divided into three sessions where one session was held each day from 20th July 2020 to 22nd July 2020 focusing on Three Tools.

Day One: The Tool for day one was "Learn to Relax and Meditate". The session was introduced by Ms Shreya Patil. As per the tradition of KJSSC the session commenced with the recitation of campus prayer by our faculty Dr Veena Salvi. followed by welcome address by our Vice- Principal Dr Lolly Jain. Ms Rakhee Arora, Zonal Coordinator and a Certified Trainer with Heartfulness was the Moderator all through our three day journey on heartfulness practices. Ms Arora introduced the resource person for day one Mr. Rajgopal Subramanyam who gave us an insight about the functioning of their organization and how it has spread its wings globally. Mr. Subramanyam involved the participants in a session on Pranayam by instructing the audience on the techniques to be adopted. Followed by defining the concept of Meditation and how one can be a beneficiary by practicing it regularly. He categorically emphasized on its importance for a regimented life ahead and the need to strike a balance between our inner and outer life. Participants were then involved in a session on meditation which was followed by a Q&A session. Mrs. Hema Chakraborty, proposed the vote of thanks and the session was closed for the day. Eighty four participants attended on the first day

Day Two: The Tool for day two "Learn to De-stress (cleaning) and Let Go". The session was introduced by Dr Archana Padgaonkar. As per the tradition of KJSSC the session commenced with the recitation of campus prayer by our faculty Dr Veena Salvi. Ms Rakhee Arora, Moderator for the session introduced the resource person for day two Ms Namrata Walvekar who commenced the session by putting up a question to be responded only in ONE WORD by the participants in their attempt to cope up with an extremely tough situation which they attempted to overcome but failed to succeed. This was followed by an activity to involve the participants where two slides were displayed with the same content, one was cluttered making it extremely difficult for the participants to understand while the other making it extremely simple and hassle free and this was done with the sole idea to explain the importance of space in one's life. Message conveyed was Don't carry any baggage









and The Power of Impression which act like coloured glasses bringing in positivity. This was followed by introducing the concept of Rejuvenation where focus was on six steps which included removal of impurities in the form of smoke and the contribution of the sacred current in the cleaning process. The participants were then instructed about the heartfulness cleaning technique which they practiced for the next 20 mins to gently complete the cleansing process .This was followed by a Q&A session. Dr Vanita Kulkarni proposed the vote of thanks and the session was closed for the day. Sixty five participants attended on the second day.

Day Three: The Tool for day three was "Make a difference to the World". The session was introduced by Dr Veena Khilnani. As per the tradition of KJSSC the session commenced with the recitation of campus prayer by our faculty Ms Purva Medhi .Ms Rakhee Arora, Moderator for the session introduced the resource person for day three Mrs. Lalitha Rajgopal. Madam spoke about the difference between ambition and aspiration and how teachers leave an impact on students, strengthening their aspiration. This was followed by the concept of three circles where the innermost circle controls our living habits and the need to balance between inner and outer lives because our lives will be cherished only because of our qualities and this concept was supported with a beautiful illustration of a 'Tree' whose strength solely depends on its roots which is not visible. Madam explained the Heartfulness cycle of practice which starts with meditation which initiates the change followed by cleaning which erases our emotional baggage and lastly the inner connect which helps us in realizing our true potential. Participants were then involved in a 20 minute prayer session and this was followed by a Q&A session. Dr. Bright Philip, proposed the vote of thanks bringing it to the end of our three day National webinar on Introduction to Heartfulness Practices.

Registrations were online and the forms were prepared by Dr. Bright Philip. The feedback link sent by heartfulness organization—was approved by Dr Vanita Kulkarni. It was sent to all the participants at the end of the three day Webinar. It also had a 10 point MCQ test based on discussions during the Webinar. Most of the participants graded the Webinar on the basis of the contents and delivery to a very high level. They also displayed their interest in being a part of such theme oriented programmes planned ahead. Sixty five participants attended the last day. Certificates were sent by Ms Shreya Patil to participants based on their attendance and to all those who contributed in organizing the event successfully. The report was prepared by Dr Archana Padgaonkar.

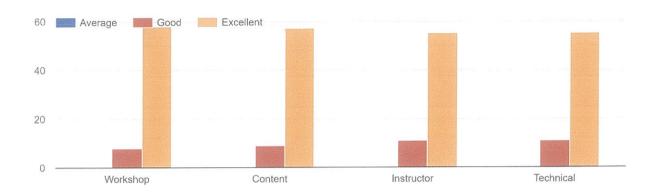

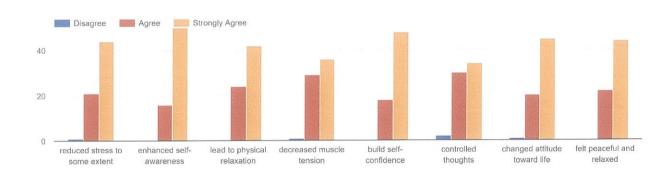




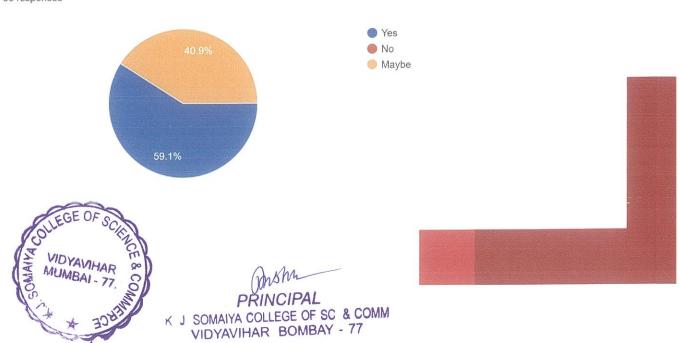
