Following were the comments/ suggestions:

- Focus could be on other parameters of excellence; it need not be only academic.
- Courses catering to industry requirements could be designed.
- Courses designed by Alumni are taken into consideration by the Institute and more efforts towards such courses should be put in.
- Activities pertaining to Criteria VII can be enhanced.
- Best practices should be evaluated and new initiatives can be taken.
- Activities are in sync with the Audit report.
- In the current pandemic situation, some measures could be adopted to facilitate the use of library books.

Agenda 5: Major highlights of activities conducted in June and July 2021 by Ms. Shreya Patil

Activities which were conducted in June and July 2021, were briefly presented and the members appreciated the activities.

Agenda 6: Presentation on Best Practices by Mr. Shabib Khan

Mr. Shabib Khan presented in a comprehensive way all the Best Practices of the Institute. The discussion ensued regarding which should be shortlisted for inclusion in NAAC SSR.

Following were the comments/ suggestions:

- Best Practices should be evaluated based on the following points-
 - Should be continuously practiced
 - Should be broad based

- Should be outcome based
- Involvement of all departments from Science and Commerce Faculty
- Uniqueness needs to be emphasized in the selection of best practices.
- Institutional distinctiveness should be reflected

The following Best Practices were put forth for discussion:

- Internship of students:
There is a need to prepare the students for Internship and also to evaluate whether the internship helps the students to be ready for employment. The current shift from constructivist approach to situated cognitive approach could be considered for curriculum enrichment. Feedback on curriculum could also be obtained from the alumni who are invited for Enriching Expressions. Collaboration could be strengthened with Somaiya center of Experiential learning and RiIDL.
- Curriculum Development:
There could be an umbrella term for curriculum enrichment, covering the methods adopted, feedback obtained and the assessment practices.
- Enriching Expressions:
Enriching Expressions seems to be a promising best practice as it is not yet defined by any external agency.
- Social engagement:
Efforts to further strengthen the contribution should be looked into.

In General, there is a need to reformulate the best practices. Currently Enriching Expressions and Social outreach belong to the same criteria (criteria V), so we need to select one of these. Curriculum enrichment could be another one from criteria II. Feasibility report of the three best practices could be presented in the next IQAC meeting.
